Raekwon E. Roldan, 19 of Latham was transported to police headquarters by State Corrections Officers, on a Town Court Bench Warrant. Roldan was implicated in a 2012 auto theft on Pinehurst Avenue in Hampton Manor but his trial was interrupted when he was sentenced to prison in another county.

In other cases;

Shakeemah T. Dixon, 29 of Albany turned herself in at police headquarters, after receiving notice from Warrant Control Officer Ronald Yeates that a Bench Warrant had been issued for her arrest. Dixon had been charged in March with stealing and was scheduled to appear in Town Court but never showed. She was booked at police headquarters by Officer Matthew Wyld and brought before Town Justice Mary Pat Donnelly.

David A. Bornt, Jr., 35 of Stuyvesant, complied with the Warrant Control Officer by reporting to police headquarters to answer a Bench Warrant. Bornt had been scheduled to appear in Town Court on March 23<sup>rd</sup> concerning a Larceny case, but he failed to appear. He was escorted to court by Officer Matthew Wyld.

Floyd B. Barry, 55 of Troy was behind the wheel of his Toyota Corolla, parked in the "no parking" fire lane in front of Walmart, when Officer Griffin Hotaling came along to ask for his license and registration. During the computer check, town police dispatchers relayed the information that Barry was wanted on a warrant issued by Troy City Court. Barry was taken into custody and turned over to Troy Police.

Collin M. Young, 24 of Pittsfield was pulled over on Columbia Turnpike about 11:30 p.m. after his Chevrolet was clocked at a speed of 60 MPH in a 40 MPH zone by Officer Matthew Wyld. Alcohol impairment was suspected, and Mr. Young failed a set of field sobriety tests. He was charged with DWI.
