Timothy D. Sluus, 33 of Averill Park was charged with DWI and Reckless Driving following a traffic accident investigation by Officer Edward Ashley. Sluus had driven his motorcycle on Troy Road at a high rate of speed into the Mannix Road traffic circle and crashed.

In other cases;

Heinz J. Granderath, 58 of East Greenbush was charged with Harassment on the complaint of his neighbors. According to the complaint and despite being warned, Granderath proceeded to detonate a half-hour aerial display of illegal fireworks from his property on the 4th of July. Unlike unlawful booming aerial displays, legal fireworks have no loud report and are displayed on the ground. The complaint was investigated by Officer Michael Herrington.

Kristen C. Kelly, 28 of Rensselaer was charged with DWI after her car was observed weaving on River Road. Officer Edward Ashley made the traffic stop.

A 13 year old North Greenbush youth was charged with Assault 3rd Dgr. and Larceny by Officer Edward Witko, following a schoolyard incident on McCullough Place. A 13 year old victim claims he was punched and his skateboard was stolen by the other youth. A witness agreed that a punch was thrown and that the skateboard was then taken. The matter will be heard in Family Court.

Anne M. Dobert, 33 of East Schodack was charged with Unlawful Possession of Marijuana when she brought marijuana and a glass smoking pipe into Town Court. The contraband was confiscated and she was ticketed by Officer Edward Ashley.

Tyler M. Wagner, 19 of East Greenbush was ticketed for Unlawful Possession of Alcohol by Officer Michael Herrington, after neighbors called police to report a group of youths drinking and smoking marijuana at Hampton Manor Park.
